Dear sisters and brothers in the churches of the Fellowship of the Middle East Evangelical Churches

We are grateful that we have been connected for many years and that we are walking a common path that helps us to understand each other better and share our concerns and needs. We greatly appreciate what we have learnt from you over the years. As a Protestant church communion, you are geographically and theologically closest to us.

We regret that the conference in Beirut in October had to be cancelled. We would have liked to get to know the situation on the ground better there and intensify relations with the member churches of the FMEEC beyond the Presidency and the General Secretary. So, we would like to write to you in these difficult times for the Holy Land and the whole Middle East and assure you that we are thinking of you and praying for you.

See, darkness covers the earth and thick darkness is over the peoples, but the Lord rises upon you and his glory appears over you. Isaiah 60:2 (NIV)

In darkest times of history, the prophet Isaiah proclaims again and again the coming of the light. He carries a message of hope. As Christians we see fulfilment of this prophetic message in Jesus Christ, who came to this world as a child born in Betlehem, a man, who walked through the lands, meeting men, women, and children, who was crucified and is risen from the dead, making visible the great glory of God.

When we look to Jesus' birth, we see that it was embedded in a complex historical context. According to scripture he was born under adverse conditions in an occupied country, his life was in danger and his parents had to flee their home country with him. This is a destiny that many people share even today.

We want to ensure you of our connectedness and furthermore active empathy, sharing with you the same hope and faith in Jesus Christ, who is the Prince of Peace. We will do our best to make sure that your fate as Christians in the Middle East will not to be overlooked and would like to offer our support to ensure that your experiences and thoughts are also heard in Europe. In our Advent letter we asked the CPCE member churches to remember the Christians in the Middle East and to continue to pray for the people in the Middle East. We pray for an end of violence, that a time of reconstruction can soon begin, giving people new perspectives on life and that God will grant the grace of reconciliation and justice between people. We believe that our present and our future are in God's hands.

May Christ's light, that is stronger than any darkness of our times, shine in the Land of God's Promises and in the whole world.
